Minutes of the meeting of the South Petherwin Parish Council on 12th August 2020 held, due to COVID-19 restrictions, via the video conferencing system Zoom.

Daw's House & South Petherwin Speed & Road Safety Concerns report had been received from the Transport & Infrastructure Service at Cornwall Council following a site meeting with residents and the Parish Council on 30th June. The report had not yet been sent to parish residents, awaiting release from South Petherwin Parish Council.

The Launceston Medical Centre expansion is due for completion in Feb 21, slightly delayed due to COVID-19. A large flu injection programme for the over 50s, key workers and the vulnerable is to be put in place for the winter.

- e. Pennygillam fly tipping, litter and hedge. A date for a site visit would be confirmed.
- f. Dog fouling. A new contract should now be in place, a bin quote would be obtained.

20/097 Current & ongoing business

- a. Toilets. The required door locks, and paper towel and soap dispensers were due to be fitted shortly, once signage was in place the toilets would reopen.
- b. Stage 4 Community Governance Review. It was proposed by Cllr M Screech, seconded by Cllr S Rogers that the Parish Council accept the Community Governance Review Panels recommendations that were put to full council, and agreed, in December 2019, all were in favour.

20/098 New business

- a. SUEZ Launceston HWRC planning proposals presentation to the Parish Council. Date to be confirmed.
- b. Launceston Community Network Climate Change Working Group. Cllr R Jeffery attended a virtual meeting on Thursday 9th July where a representative from Forest for Cornwall held a discussion on public access to woods and forest. The wooded area in Pennygillam Industrial Estate was discussed, updates to follow.

20/101 Urgent items.

- a. Confirmation had recently been received that Parish Councils, who are eligible for Small Business Rates Relief, could apply for the Business Rates COVID-19 grant payment. It was proposed by Cllr D Rogers, seconded by Cllr C Powlesland, that the Parish Council apply for this grant payment, all were in favour
- b. People in Cornwall whose home or business is not covered by the current Superfast Cornwall programme plans for receiving fibre broadband could be eligible for up to £1,500 towards reliable superfast broadband in the next year as part of the Government's Broadband Upgrade Fund. The registration website is not working and this will be investigated.
- c. The County Councillor would be asked to comment on poor visibility at road junctions due to uncut hedgerows and to clarify if the responsibility of hedgerow cutting now sat with Cornwall Council Environment Department.

The Chairman, Cllr P Parsons, declared an interest and left the meeting. It was proposed by Cllr D Rogers, seconded by Cllr S Rogers, that the vice-chair, Cllr R Jeffery, take the Chair, all were in favour.

- d. Annual Churchyard grants. It was decided that this would be discussed at next month's meeting.
- e. The A30 at Treburyse to Tregadillet. The pavement was greatly constricted by the hedge with brambles encroaching onto the pavement. This would be reported again.
